**Information for Parents**

**School External Teaching & Learning Review**

The school recently organised an external review of its progress since our previous OFSTED inspection. Colmore Partnership Teaching School Alliance (CPTSA) performed the review. The review went very well and was further ratification of the great progress since our inspection of 2017. Here's a few extracts from the report. CPTSA said :

- There is a consistent approach to teaching and learning based on high quality CPD. Both Maths and English has improved and so too has the quality of outcomes and experiences, as evidenced in books from Years 3 to 6.
- There is an impressive culture of shared accountability across the whole team. Leadership should be proud of their achievements in this area. They are constantly striving to improve and are receptive to new ideas and expect this of their team.
- Learning behaviour was exceptional. There has been a significant improvement in how the children behave in lessons and the levels of engagement. We saw no examples of low level behaviour problems.
- Conduct behaviour was also excellent. The outdoor environment was calm and organised and we saw impressive examples of children organising younger children in monitor roles.

The school works collaboratively with a number of schools and organisations and is constantly striving to improve.

OFSTED recognised the journey the school had been on when they wrote: 'Since his appointment, the headteacher has been unwavering in his determination to secure a quality standard of education for pupils in this school. He has been supported by very capable deputy headteachers and governors. Leaders and the whole staff team are focused on improving the quality of teaching and the rates of progress that pupils make in their learning. The impact of the team's work is beginning to emerge.'

At RHJS we know that effective, long term school improvement is not a quick fix. We'd like to assure all parents and carers that we remain unwavering in our desire to improve outcomes for children at our school.

**Policy & SEND Information Report**

During the Autumn term, Mrs Jones (SENDco), Charlotte Bull (SEND Governor) and three randomly selected parents of SEND children from school, met to review and evaluate the school's existing SEND Policy and SEND Information Report. Our aim was to make the policy and report more concise, easier to understand and easier to access for all. This document will be reviewed and co-produced on an annual basis in consultation with randomly selected parents of SEND children in school. We plan to do this to ensure that it reflects the needs of our children, and the policies and practice of our school.
